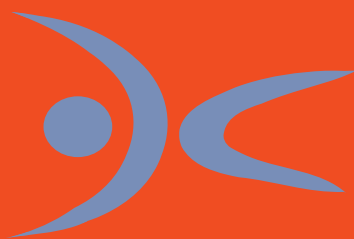

"The Fundamentals of Sexual Assault" provides a solid foundation on sexual assault issues that new advocates and volunteers will find helpful in their work with sexual assault survivors. This training includes hands-on exercises to develop skills sets.

- ✓ **Identifying Victimization-** Is it just a legal definition or are the victim's perceptions and feelings part of the definition?

- ✓ **Listening Skills-** When to listen and when to give feedback or ask questions!
- ✓ **Reporting Standards-** When you must report to the authorities.
- ✓ **Documentation of Client Files-** Protecting the clients' privacy.

- ✓ **Navigating the 'Systems'-** How do we help the survivor get from one system to another without further trauma and frustration?

- ✓ **Prevention-** Stopping the violence before it begins
